Assignment:

Notice the kinds of feasibility questions being asked in here for funding support; be ready to share what jumped out to you in the reading. For <u>JOURNAL # 3</u>, post 3 points you'd raise in class next time.
- 2. **JOURNAL # 4:** In order to start drafting a grant proposal, I'll need to match your interests with real organizations. So then, imagine you're working/part of an organization that is seeking funds. What kinds of non-profit organization would you like to be part of? A Soup kitchen? An animal shelter? A hospital? An environmental organization? For the purpose of our group project, spend 15 minutes thinking and writing about what kinds non-profits you'd like be part of and why—provide 3 examples.
