## Project # 4—Why? A Digital Project

The goal of this most elaborate and collaborative "speech" (more of a presentation, really) is to help an audience understand <u>more about your chosen major and why you personally feel this is the right path for you</u>. Consider that there is the need to explain to the audience and make them care about this major and how you fit into it. You will have different roles for this project depending on which <u>path</u> (see below) you follow. This assignment will require time to meet with your group outside of regular class time to plan, film, and edit your digital project.

# There are 3 paths for this project:

**Roundtable Discussion**: 3 people help an audience understand more about your chosen major and why you personally feel this is the right path for you. Think of this as something that you might see offered in an academic environment.

**News Report**: Some room for creativity here. You will need to play the roles of news anchors and reporters to deliver news stories about your major—could be an investigation, "This just in," a Q and A, lots of possibilities. Maybe you interview someone (not in our class) who is in your major or teaches in the major? That would be cool. Ultimately, the goal here is for 3 people to help an audience understand more about your chosen major and why you personally feel this is the right path for you as delivered through the genre of a newscast.

**Talk Show**: More room for creativity here, more humor possibilities too. For this path, imagine someone would need to play the role of talk show host and interview guests. Consider the genre of a talk show vs. a news report—one is likely more jovial than another. Ultimately, the goal here is for 3 people to help an audience understand more about your chosen major and why you personally feel this is the right path for you as delivered through the genre of a talk show.

# In any of these paths, researching your major and explaining in the proper format is essential.

You will all have 3 weeks from now to complete the following:

# Each SPEECH 4 page should have the following:

- Brainstorm/Outline/script of program *draft 5 pts.*
- Video of your dry-dry-run *5 pts.*
- Reflection of dry-dry-run (copied from journal # 17) 5 pts.
- Video of your dry-run **5** pts.
- Reflection of dry-run (copied from journal # 18) 5 pts.
- Updated Brainstorm/Outline/script of program 5 pts.
- Green screen edited video\* 65 pts.

- Reflection on the process/role in group (copied from journal #19) 5 pts.
- There's also a bonus podcast option I'll mention soon enough (3 pts.)

\*The green screen video will be evaluated in the follow ways (should total 65 pts):

## Comprehension and Style: 15 pts.

For this category, you will work with your group to construct a speech that fits appropriately with the *path* you take—you might think of this in terms of understanding the genre.

### Delivery: 20 pts.

### Technical Polish: 10 pts.

This is where your technology chops come in handy. You'll definitely want to work with the Digispace folks to make this look good. **USE THE GREEN SCREEN** room—book it for filming. Book time, too, for **EDITING** your work. Make sure to have credits, music (intros and outros) and edits brining in other scenes, images, artifacts. It takes time to edit, likely 90 minutes or so, so make sure you budget your time and book ahead.
