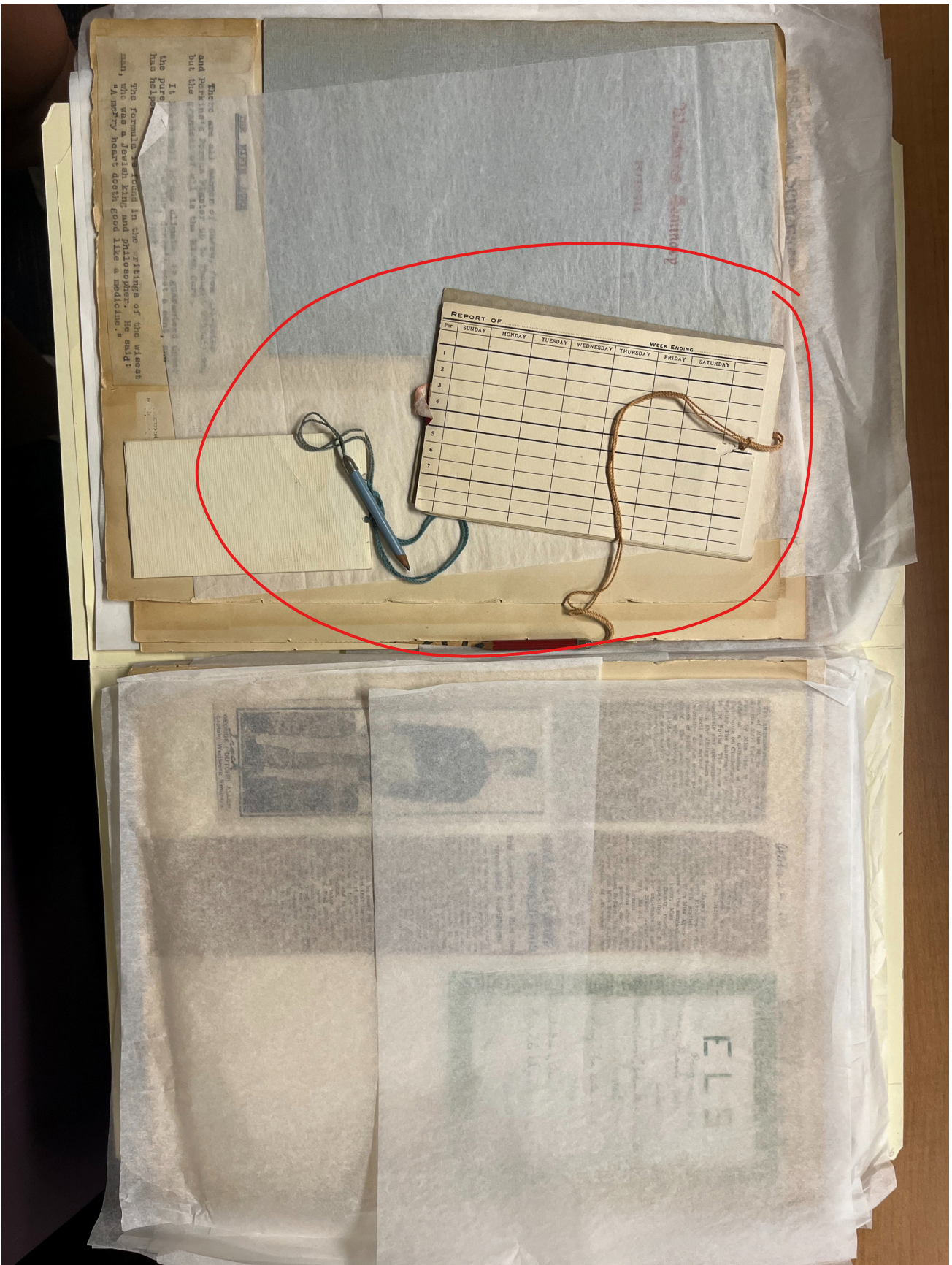


Weaknesses: Newspapers are layered on top of one another due to adhesive failing. Visible creasing and crumbling of paper overtime from improper storage/handling. Requires viewer to have to touch each individual piece of paper, increasing material's exposure oils and dirt from hands. Risk of ink transfer from newspaper onto program.

Improvements: Attempt to unfold newspaper clippings/reattach. Digitalize articles to create surrogate document to limit amount of contact made with the original source while allowing individuals to still interact with the source. If unable to reattach or digitalize, use mylar sleeve to protect papers.



Strengths: Use of archival paper to prevent items from touching.

Weakness: Items such as the dance cards visible in photo are loose. This is particularly concerning since the pencils of the dance cards are still affixed to the cards. Archival tissue paper is not properly fitted causing stress on pages since user must try to flip two separate pieces of paper

How to improve: Fit single piece of archival paper to scrapbook page, place loose items that could be potentially damaging or fragile into archive-grade envelopes.

Jan. 7, 1914. Portland Beats Seminary 15 to 13 and Thornton Sex- tons Bridgton High Miss Hill Makes Point Scored Local Team.

In the first period, Westbrooke Sem. was the first team to score, Miss Helen Hill shooting a goal from the foul line. Portland followed suit a moment later trying the score. Portland then got the jump on their rivals scoring two field goals in quick succession. Westbrooke followed with two field goals, then Portland got one goal from the floor, after a pretty pass from Miss Conley to Miss Craven who quickly tossed the ball into the rim. Miss Helen Hill ended the scoring, leaving the score, 8-5 in favor of the Portland team.

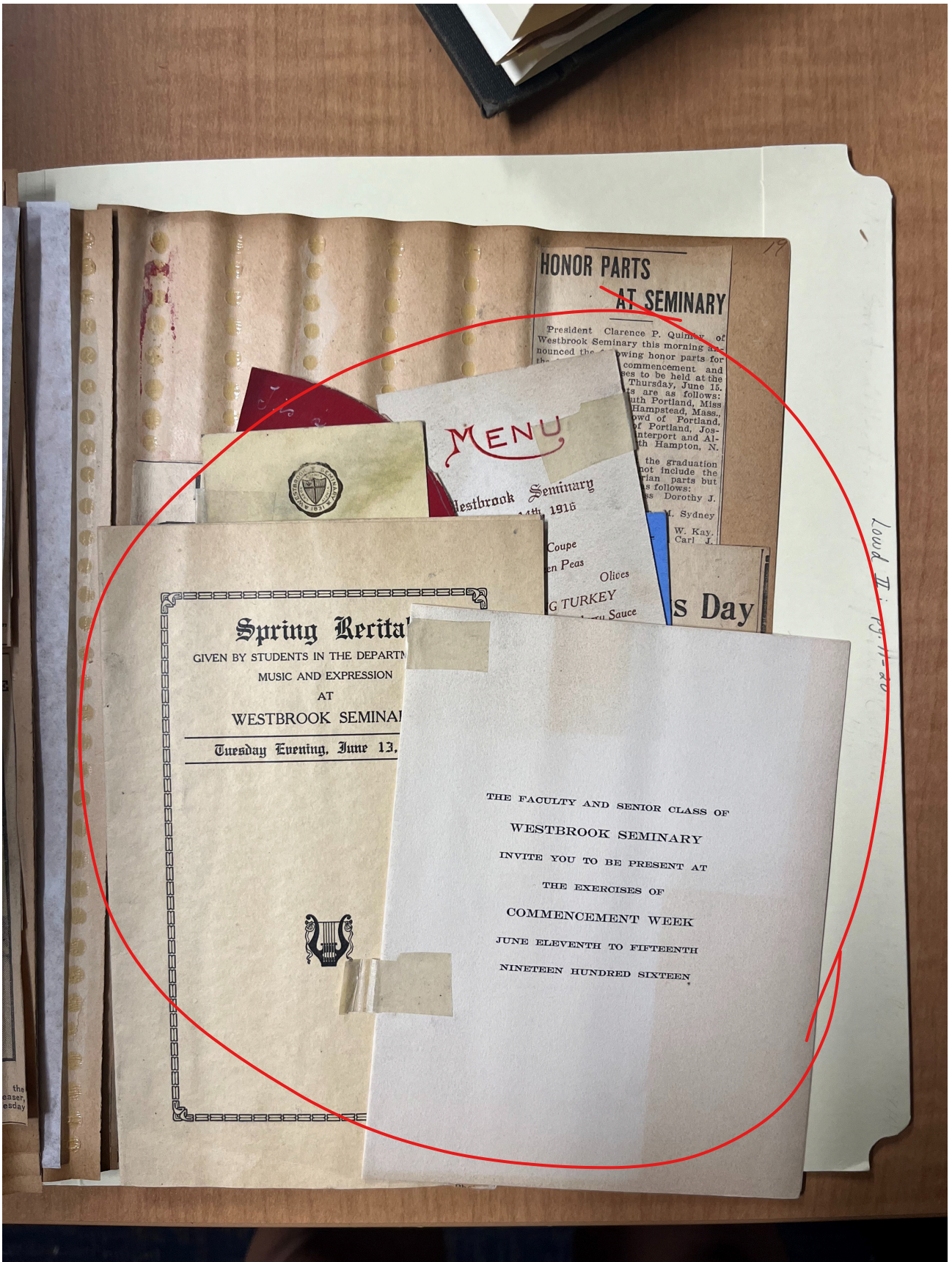
Capt. Sophomore Class Basket Ball Team, U. of M.

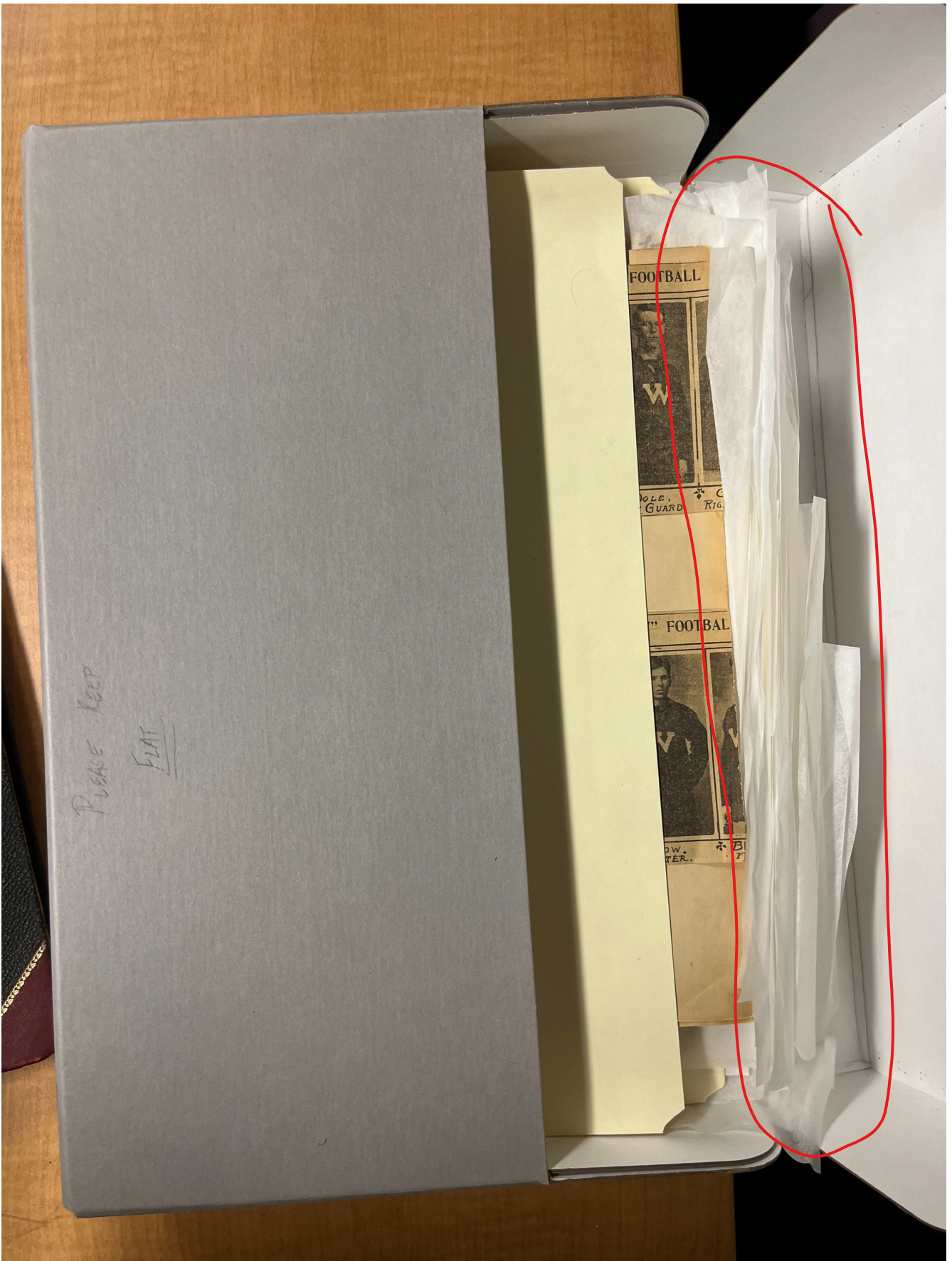

Feb 11, 1914
Captain Allen of the Westbrooke Seminary track team was at Bowdoin College over Sunday, and Saturday afternoon worked out on the Bowdoin indoor track. Allen ran the half mile in 2:04, bettering the State interscholastic indoor record held by Frank Pretl of Portland by eight seconds.



Items are stacked on top of each other--requiring viewer to handle each individual item before even know the material is relevant to their research topic. Excess handling can be harmful to paper items due to oils on hands/fingers. Loose items prevent scrapbook from being viewed in its intended form. Visible tape covers several of the items unknown if that was the original method of adhering those materials to scrapbook pages.

Improvements: Repasted the items to the scrapbook pages if possible. Remove tape (consider the original how that adds to viewer experience)? Mylar sleeve for programs to prevent materials interacting with each other.



Weaknesses: Excess use of archival tissue paper creates bulk on in the box. Puts pressure on the edges of pag when box is closed which could advance the deteriorating and crumbling of paper.

Improvements: Add spacer/"tuxedo" box to keep folders more compact. Make sure single sheets of correctly archival paper is used.
