#### Literature Cited format:

Schott J, Priest J. 2002. *Leading antenatal classes: a practical guide*. 2nd ed. Boston (MA): Books for Midwives.

Author/s. Year of publication. Book title. Edition. Place of publication: Publisher name.

#### In-Text format:

(Schott and Priest 2002)

Note: if more than two authors published a book or an article, then the citation would have to be (Schott et al. 2002)

### BOOK CHAPTER

#### Literature Cited format:

McDaniel TK, Valdivia RH. 2005. *Cellular microbiology*. 2<sup>nd</sup> ed. Washington (DC): ASM Press. Chapter 2, *New tools for virulence gene discovery*; p. 473–488.

Author/s. Year of publication. Book title. Edition. Place of publication: Publisher name. Chapter number, Chapter title; page/s.

#### Literature Cited format:

Author/s. Year of publication. Book title. Edition. Place of publication: Publisher name. page/s.

### JOURNAL ARTICLE (print)

#### Literature Cited format:

Note: In an article title, only the first word and species names are capitalized. Also, the journal title must be written in abbreviated form if it is longer than two words.
