

## Brochure Presentation

For your the brochure you created, please plan on delivering a **4-7 minute** group presentation on project.

Your task for the presentation is to guide us through each panel of your brochure and help us understand how you've answered the questions associated with your specific theme. The brochure will be, essentially, a visual aid or a prop for the presentation; however, your goal is **to unpack and expand on and explain (not just read aloud) the information your gathered and arranged in the brochure.**

Make sure to help us understand **WHY** the people you've interviewed are helpful and reputable to help answer the questions for your project theme.

Help us, too, understand how the photos/images you've created help to further the work of your brochure. Help us understand what we're looking at and, if appropriate, where these images are taken from on campus.

Make sure to identify the theme early in your presentation so the audience can follow along.

### Specifics:

Please be ready to show the brochure on the screen to discuss it; this will mean making sure you can patch into the projector computer successfully **BEFORE** presentation day.

Make sure each member of your group has equal presentation time—one member could lead your group through the presentation, but everyone should have relatively the same amount of “screen time.”

You have 4-7 minutes; to earn full credit, you'll want to deliver the presentation in that time window. Under or over by more than 10 seconds will reduce the overall score.

Preparation and rehearsal: You'll want to spend some time before you present rehearsing so that your presentation runs smoothly; you're welcome to work off notecards or an outline if you like, but the emphasis on the presentation is to share your project and unpack its specifics for the class **without** a script. This means *practice*.
